1. What is hand-diving?

A type of fishing for scallops. A diver will swim down to the seabed and handgathers the scallops into a netted bag.

- 2. Name two benefits of hand-diving for scallops.
 - It's incredibly selective.
 - It leaves the rest of the seabed undisturbed.
- 3. How many of Jersey's scallops are caught by hand-diving (in %)?
 - 25%

4. How can you tell if the scallops you eat in a restaurant are 'Jersey Hand Dived'?

- You will see the Jersey Hand Dived logo on window stickers or cards.
- It will say "Jersey Hand Dived scallops" on the menu.
- 5. Name three items of equipment needed to dive for scallops.
 - Any of the following:
 - Mask; fins; scuba gear; tank; dive watch; dry suit



- 6. How many scallops can a diver fit in a catch bag?
 - Around 300
- 7. What is the Minimum Landing Size (MLS) of Jersey scallops (in mm) and why is this needed?
 - 102mm. This is to ensure the smaller scallops can grow big enough to reproduce before they are able to be caught from the sea.

8. Who owns the seabed in Jersey?

- The public of Jersey (us!)
- 9. Name two challenges that scallop divers can face while diving.
 - Any of the following:
 - Bad visibility (so they can't see very far); strong tides; cold weather

10. In your opinion, what is the most important message in this factfile?
